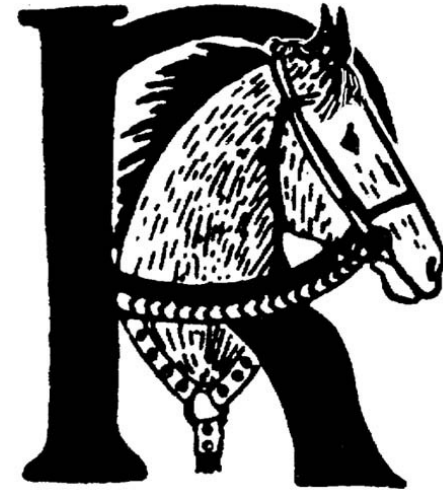

Pleasure *Entry level riders only. May not enter any other classes besides 1-3 . **For attire rules see conditions of entry.***

1. Pleasure Rider- Walk–Trot Equitation On the Flat
2. Pleasure Horse – Walk-Trot Hunter Under Saddle
3. Pleasure Rider over Poles – after class 2, Riders to line up and trot over poles one at a time.
4. **Open Walk-Trot Under Saddle** *Will be split between professionals and amateur if entries warrant.*

Beginner Walk-Trot *Amateurs Only, 12" crossbars, 1x around arena. Riders must trot to first fence. Will be judged as one division but hunter and equitation points will be split for year end.*

5. Beginner Hunter I O/F
6. Beginner Equitation O/F
7. Beginner Walk-Trot Hunter U/S
8. Beginner Walk-Trot Equitation On the Flat

Intermediate Walk-Trot *Amateurs Only. 12" crossbars , course of 6-8 jumps. May trot or canter course. Will be judged as one division but hunter and equitation points will be split for year end.*

9. Intermediate Hunter I O/F
10. Intermediate Equitation O/F
11. Intermediate Walk-Trot Hunter U/S
12. Intermediate Walk-Trot Equitation On the Flat

NWAHJA Warm Up Class *Judged class over specific course, use as a warm-up before your division at your desired height – may not ride a warm up for Equitation Classes (i.e. 20,27,29,39 or 41) or Jumper Classes.*

Maiden Hunter *Open to horses/ponies in first or second year of showing over fences. 12"crossbars and 18" verticals. Maiden Hunter Under Saddle is combined with Class 3 Open Walk-Trot Under Saddle.*

NWAHJA Perpetual Trophies

Best Child Rider on a Pony Award

To be awarded to the NWAHJA member in good standing, ages 17 and under, same pony/ rider combination, who has accumulated the most points in these divisions: 2ft Amateur Hunter, 2' Equitation, Baby Green Hunter, Modified Amateur Hunter, Education Equitation, NWAHJA Hunter, Low Hunter and 3' Hunter. Medal and Jumper class points do not count towards year end points for this trophy.

Best Child Rider on a Horse Award

To be awarded to the NWAHJA member in good standing, ages 17 and under, same horse/ rider combination, who has accumulated the most points in these divisions: 2ft Amateur Hunter, 2' Hunter, 2' Equitation, Baby Green Hunter, Modified Amateur Hunter, Education Equitation, NWAHJA Hunter, Low Hunter and 3' Hunter. Medal and Jumper class points do not count towards year end points for this trophy.

Horse of the Year Award

To be awarded to the horse ridden by a NWAHJA member or members in good standing, professional or amateur, who has accumulated the most points in the following divisions: 2ft Hunter, 2'Amateur Hunter, Baby Green Hunter, Modified Amateur Hunter, NWAHJA Hunter, Low Hunter and 3' Hunter. Medal, Jumper, and Equitation classes do not count towards year end trophy.

High Point Pony Rider of the Year Award

Open to all NWAHJA members in good standing, both Professional and Amateur, with same pony/ rider combination, who accumulates most points in all classes recognized by NWAHJA, excluding Medal Classes.

High Point Horse Rider Award

Open to all NWAHJA members in good standing, both Professional and Amateur, with same horse/ rider combination, who accumulates most points in all classes recognized by NWAHJA, excluding Medal Classes.

Serendipity Award

Awarded to the school horse/pony earning most points in classes beginning with: Beginner Walk/ Trot 12" Crossbars. Multiple Riders are acceptable. Pleasure Rider/Horse/Over Poles and Open Walk/Trot u/saddle are excluded. However, in the one day show format, the Open Walk/trot u/ saddle will count for Maiden Hunter points and count for the Serendipity Award.

Cocoa Puff Memorial Spirit Award

This special award will be given to the rider, 17 and under, who has exhibited good sportsmanship and horsemanship skills throughout the year both at horse shows and at their home barn. At the end of each show season, trainers may submit, in writing, a descriptive paragraph about the exhibitor to the NWAHJA Board. This is not about the number of points accumulated or the number of ribbons won, but about kindness, self control, generosity and putting the horse's needs first. This award is donated by Kayvonne Primm and Morning Star Farm in remembrance of the special pony, Cocoa Puff, who selflessly taught dozens of children to ride and jump.

Best Amateur Adult Rider Award

To be awarded to the NWAHJA member in good standing, 17 yrs of age and over, same horse/ same rider combination, who has accumulated the most points in the following divisions: 2' Hunter through 3' Hunter. Medal and Jumper classes do not count towards this trophy.

Kit Kalypso Award

To be awarded to the horse or pony ridden by a NWAHJA member in good standing who accumulates the most points in the Jumper Divisions. This trophy is being offered by Laura McKenzie of Lakepoint Farm in remembrance of Kit Kalypso, a horse who was champion in victory and defeat.

Education Equitation: Amateurs only. Scholarship class. Riders may choose fence heights of 2'6" or 2'9". Rounds will be ridden throughout the day as course heights are changed for other divisions. Open to all amateur riders regardless of age or membership. However, riders wishing to compete for the scholarship must meet the following requirements:

- Notification of Intent recorded with NWAHJA
- Member in good standing with NWAHJA
- Junior or Senior in High School
- Grade Point Average of 3.0 or higher

NWAHJA Hunter: Open to all. Fence heights 2'6"

Low Hunter: Open to all. Fence heights 2'9"

Puddle Jumper Level 0: 2'3" – 2'6": Table IV, Sec. 1: Cross-entry of horse/rider into Future Jumpers only. Optimum time will be set for the course, faults converted to time. Riders closest to Optimum Time (over or under) wins the class.

Future Jumper Level 0: 2'6" – 2'9": Table IV, Sec. 1: Optimum time will be set for the course, faults converted to time. Rider closest to Optimum Time (over or under) wins the class. **Table II, Sec. 2b:** First round is timed, riders with a clear first round will, without leaving the ring and upon audible signal, commence the jump-off course. If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for 1st place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide.

Training Jumper Level 1: 2'9"- 3': Table II, Sec. 2b: same as above. **Table II, Sec. 2c:** If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, rider will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the designated jump-off course. Time starts as the horse crosses the finish line for the initial course. If there are not any clean rounds and a tie exists for 1st place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide.

Open Jumper Level 2: 3'-3'3": Table II, Sec. 2c: same as above. **Table II, Sec. 1:** Speed class, first round is timed and fastest clear round wins the class.

Warm-Up: Open to all. Warm-up rounds can be ridden before any hunter class to be judged. Riders cannot ride a warm-up round before any Equitation Class including but not limited to: Education Equitation, 2' Medal, NWAHJA Medal, Progressive Medal, or any Jumper Class.

Progressive Hunter *Must be 12 years of age or over. If warranted can be divided into age groups 12-17 and 18-up. Jumps include 18" crossbars, 18" verticals and 2' verticals. Walk, trot and canter in U/S.*

Short / Long Stirrup *Amateurs Only, 18" fences, no oxers Will be judged as one division but hunter and equitation points will be split for year end. Walk, trot and canter in Under Saddle and On the Flat classes. Class will be split if there are three (3) entrants for each division.*

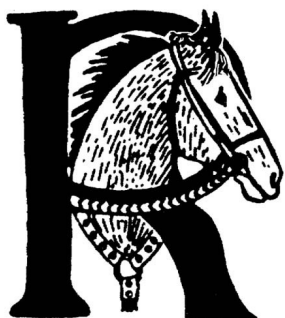

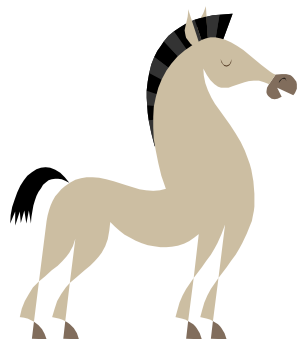

be owned by a member of NWAHJA in good standing in order to enter this class. This is an equitation class over a course that is moderately more difficult than a typical hunter course. The course stresses competent and accurate riding skills. The top four riders after the first round may be called back for additional testing. All riders accumulating 13 points or more in their division through the show season will qualify for the medal finals held at the NWAHJA Year-End Show. There will be qualifying medal classes held at the Year-End Show with the finals held after.

2' Medal 2' fences, may have oxers with maximum spread of 2'. USEF Tests 1-6 may be used for work-off on the flat. (See USEF Tests listed below) It is the judge's discretion as to which test may be used.

NWAHJA Medal Fences 2'6". USEF Tests 1-13 may be used for a work-off. (See USEF Tests listed below) It is the judge's discretion as to which test may be used.

USEF Tests From Which Judges Must Choose for Medal Classes

(Taken directly from USEF Rule Book)

- Tests may be performed either collectively or individually but no other tests may be used. Instructions must be publicly announced. A judge may ask riders to re-jump an abbreviated or shortened form of the original course. NOTE: In Hunter Seat Equitation classes, any exhibitor who does not participate in the testing is placed last of those competitors called back to test. Should more than one exhibitor fail to return for testing they will be placed at the judge's discretion. If exhibitors are called back collectively to test, they must remain in the ring until all exhibitors have completed the test. Equitation tests must not have exhibitors trotting or cantering through in gate or out gate. Obstacles jumped in an equitation test must have been included in the original course. Jumps must be jumped in the original direction unless otherwise specified. BOD 1/17/10 Effective 12/1/10 EC 9/20/10 Effective 12/1/10
1. Halt (4 to 6 seconds) or halt and back. When riders working collectively are asked to halt and then back, they must not be penalized if they walk forward a few steps and halt after backing.
 2. Hand gallop.
 3. Figure eight at trot, demonstrating change of diagonals. At left diagonal, rider should be sitting the saddle when left front leg is on the ground; at right diagonal, rider should be sitting the saddle when right front leg is on the ground; when circling clockwise at a trot, rider should be on left diagonal; when circling counterclockwise, rider should be on the right diagonal.
 4. Figure eight at canter on correct lead, demonstrating simple change of lead. This is a change whereby the horse is brought back into a walk or trot (either is acceptable unless the judge specifies) and restarted into a canter on the opposite lead. Figures to be commenced in center of two circles so that one change of lead is shown.
 5. Work collectively or individually at a walk, trot and/or canter.
 6. Jump low obstacles at a trot as well as at a canter. The maximum height and spread for a trot jump is 3' for horses, 2' for ponies.
 7. Jump obstacles on figure eight course.
 8. Question(s) regarding basic horsemanship, tack and equipment and conformation.
 9. Ride without stirrups, riders must be allowed option to cross stirrups.
 10. Jump low obstacles at a walk as well as at a canter. The maximum height and spread for a walk jump is 2'.
 11. Dismount and mount. Individually.
 12. Turn on the forehand done through the walk or the halt.
 13. Figure eight at canter on correct lead demonstrating flying change of lead.

Baby Green Hunter: Open to horses or ponies in their first or second consecutive year of showing in a competition over fences. The courses consist of fences not to exceed 2'3" in height, with small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. The riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class.

Modified Amateur Hunter: Amateurs only. The courses consist of fences not to exceed 2'3" in height, with small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. The riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class.

NWAHJA CLASSES & DIVISIONS

Conditions of Entry

Pleasure: Amateurs Only. This division is for entry-level riders only. Rider may not enter any other classes at show. Class number 1 and 2 are under-saddle only, riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. Class number 3 may include two (2) ground poles placed separately to be trotted over. This class may progress over show season to four (4) ground poles. *Although we encourage traditional riding attire (classes 1-3 pleasure attire is suitable... hard heeled shoe, neutral color schooling tights(with belt if loops), helmet and shirt with sleeves and collar. No jeans or cowboy boots.*

Open Walk-Trot Under Saddle: Open to all. Riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. Class may be split between professionals and amateurs if entries warrant.

Beginner Walk/Trot Hunter and Equitation: Amateurs Only. The course for this division will be four (4) 12" crossbars set as two (2) lines, one line on each side of ring. The rider will jump once around only. The rider may trot the entire course or trot to the line and canter away. Riders may not canter in to any first fence of a line. On the flat, the riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. No cross-entry into any other division is allowed by that horse/rider combination.

Intermediate Walk/Trot Hunter and Equitation: Amateurs Only. The course will be 12" crossbars with optional diagonal lines or a single fence present. The rider may trot the entire course, trot to the line and canter away, or canter the entire course. On the flat, the riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. No cross-entry into any other division is allowed by that horse/rider combination.

Maiden Hunter: Open to horses or ponies in their first or second year of showing over fences. The course will be seven (7) or eight (8) jumps consisting of 12" crossbars and/or 18" verticals. For the under-saddle class riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in both directions.

Leadline: No age limit. Horse or pony must be led/controlled by a qualified horse leader. Entrants may not enter any other classes in show.

Progressive Hunter: Riders must be 12 years of age or over. If warranted, classes may be divided into age groups 12-17 and 18 - up. The jumps will include 18" crossbars, 18" verticals and 2' verticals. The riders will show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under saddle class.

Short Stirrup Hunter and Equitation: 11 and under. Amateurs only. The courses are simple with seven (7) or eight (8) small 18" verticals. Entrants are encouraged to canter the courses as a stepping stone towards more advanced divisions. On the flat and in the under-saddle class, the riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in both directions.

Long Stirrup Hunter and Equitation: 12 and over. Amateurs only. The courses are simple with seven (7) or eight (8) small verticals. Entrants are encouraged to canter the courses as a stepping stone towards more advanced divisions. On the flat and in the under-saddle class, the riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in both directions.

2' Hunter: Open to all. The courses consist of fences not to exceed 2' in height, with small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. The riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class.

2' Amateur Hunter: Amateurs only. The courses consist of fences not to exceed 2' in height with small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. The riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class

2' Equitation: Amateurs only. The course will consist of fences not to exceed 2" in height with small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. The riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the flat class.

2' Medal, NWAHJA Medal, and Progressive Medal A Medal: Junior and Amateurs only. Equitation classes. The rider must be a member of NWAHJA in good standing and the horse must

Rules and Guidelines

Fees:

- \$12 per class if made by 7pm the Wednesday before the show. After that time, there will be a \$20 late fee. Warm-Up Class fee of \$12, and will be judged.
- A \$15 EMT/Office fee will be charged for each horse/rider combination.
- There will be a \$10 non-member fee for each horse/rider combination.
- There will be a \$25 grounds/schooling fee per day for horses wishing to participate in schooling breaks only.
- Stalls /paddocks will be available to out of towners only on a limited basis at \$25 per day or \$50 for the weekend. Call Rachel at 479-957-5331
- Make all entries to Rachel Sargent at rico@pgtc.com or 479-957-5331 before 7 pm the Wednesday before the show, must include your member number or a non member fee will be applied. Entries after that time will be charged a \$20 late fee the day of the show.

Show Rules

- NWAHJA Ring Steward is on duty for show safety, management, schooling and questions. Please do not approach the judge during the show.
- Proper show attire required (attire rules to be found at www.nwahja.com or in the NWAHJA Rule Book) with exception of Classes 1-3. ATSM/SEI protective headgear required when mounted.
- Attire for Pleasure Division only, Classes 1-3. Although we encourage traditional riding attire, pleasure attire of a hard heeled shoe or boot, neutral colored schooling tights (with belt if loops), approved helmet and a shirt with collar and sleeves will be acceptable. No jeans and/or cowboy boots allowed.
- One year negative Coggins is REQUIRED and will be checked upon arrival.
- Classes 1-12 will be pinned through 10th place if entries warrant. Points for Year-End Awards awarded through 6th place. Ribbons and gift Certificates for Champion and Reserve Champion.
- A horse/rider combination may only cross enter divisions with fence heights of six (6) inch difference. This includes flat and under saddle classes, jumper classes excluded.
- In the event that a division does not fill (3 or more riders) and cannot be combined with another division, the class will run with half points being awarded.
- The One Minute Rule will be enforced at all times. A rider will have one (1) minute to enter the arena when called or be penalized by disqualification in that class. Out of respect for other competitors and the judge, this rule is not up for discussion. **BE PREPARED!**

- In order to accumulate points for year-end awards, the rider must be a NWAHJA Member in Good Standing and volunteer four (4) hours for the organization over the course of the NWAHJA show season.
- Please return your number to the registration table before leaving the show.
- Please read through the NWAHJA Rule Book to acquaint yourself with class descriptions and other conditions of entry.
- Any horse or pony known to kick must wear a red ribbon in its tail as a warning to other competitors.
- Entry into one over fences class in a division is prohibited. Rider must enter the whole division or only the under saddle/flat class.

Concessions: Full Concessions will be available.
