Warm-Up Class fee of \$12. **Hunter Challenges, and Jumper Challenge—Class fee of \$20.** Make all entries to Lori Bayyari at loribay64@yahoo.com or 479/466-5555 before 7pm on **TUESDAY JULY 6**, must include your NWAHJA member # or \$10 non-member fee will be applied.

FEES:

\$20 EMT/Office fee will be charged for each horse/rider combination.

\$10 non-member fee for each horse/rider combination.

\$12 schooling fee on Friday July 10 for each horse/rider combination.

STALLS: Stalls will be available with out of town entrants getting priority. Cost is \$25/stall per day. You will be required to provide your own shavings. NWAHJA Show Rules

- Proper show attire required. ASTM/SEI protective headgear required when mounted. See NWAHJA Rulebook for detailed information.
- One Year negative Coggins is REQUIRED, and will be checked upon arrival.
- Classes 1-12 will be pinned through 10th place if entries warrant, points for year-end awarded through 6th place.
- A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into divisions with fence heights of a six (6) inch difference. This includes flat and under saddle classes. Jumper classes excluded.
- Management reserves the right to cancel a class or division with less than 3 entrants.
- The 1 minute rule will be enforced at all times. A rider will have 1 minute to enter the arena when called or be penalized by disqualification in that class, regardless of trainer/arena conflict.
- All Amateur classes will be split by Junior/Adult if entries warrant. Must have 3 entrants for each age group in order to split class.
- Any horse known to kick must wear a red ribbon in its tail as a warning to other competitors.
- Un-judged/Exhibition rounds, excluding the Warm-Up (Class A/B), will be allowed at NWAHJA sanctioned shows, fee \$12.
- Please return your number to the registration table before leaving the show.
- In order to accumulate points for year-end awards the rider must be a member of NWAHJA and **volunteer at least 4 hours** over the course of NWAHJA shows, as well as compete and receive points in that division in at least 3 NWAHJA recognized shows. **NWAHJA affiliated barns have set working days. If jobs are not completed those barns will be fined \$100. Work days on NWAHJA website.**
- Please read through the NWAHJA rulebook to acquaint yourself with class descriptions and other conditions of entry.

The NWAHJA Club, its officers, board members and general membership will not be held responsible for damages or injuries to any person, animal, or other property occurring at the horse show or on the show grounds. NWAHJA CLASSES & DIVISIONS

Pleasure Horse/Pleasure Rider: Amateurs Only. This division is for entry-level riders only, and not entering any other classes at this show. Flat only - riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. No cross-entry into any other divisions is allowed by that rider.

Beginner Walk/Trot Hunter & Equitation: Amateurs Only. The course for these divisions will be (4) cross rails once around. The rider may trot the entire course or trot to the jump and canter away. Riders may not canter in to any first fence of a line. On the flat, the riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. No cross-entry into any other divisions is allowed by that horse/rider combination.

Future Jumper Level 0: 2'6-2'9": Table IV, Sec 1: Optimum time will be set for the course, faults converted to time. Rider closest to Optimum time (over or under) win the class. **Table II, Sec 2b:** First round is timed, riders with a clear first round will, without leaving the ring, upon audible signal, commence the jump-off course. If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide.

A & B. Warm-Up (\$12): Open to All. Warm-Up rounds can be ridden before any hunter class, but will be un-judged. Riders cannot ride a warm-up round before any Equitation Class, Medal Class or any Jumper Classes.



SPECIAL CLASSES—Entry Fee \$20 per class

Hunter Challenges: NWAHJA is pleased to announce the addition of Hunter Challenge classes to the Summer Classic. This year each division will have it's own Challenge. The Challenge class and Hunter #3 are one and the same. This class will be double scored/pinned. After all rounds are complete monies and ribbons through 6th will be awarded for the Challenge class as well as ribbons and points through 6th towards the respective division.

AA. 2 ft. Hunter Challenge. Open to all eligible 2ft. Hunters (riders from big and little days).

BB. 2'3" Hunter Challenge. Open to all 2'3" hunters.

CC. NWAHJA Hunter Challenge (2'6"). Open to all hunters.

DD. Low Hunter Challenge (2'9" or 3') Open to all hunters.

GG. Intermediate Hunter Challenge. Amateurs only. Designed for Beginner and Intermediate hunters.

HH. Progressive Hunter Challenge. Open to all riders. Designed for all 18" cross rail hunters

II. Silver Stirrup Challenge. Amateurs only. Designed for short and long stirrup hunters.

JJ. Modified 2ft. Hunter Challenge. Open to all 2ft. Hunters (riders from big and little days).

EE. Costume Equitation. Open to all rider. The rider are encouraged to use costume for there horses and themselves. The Rider will be expected to walk and trot in both directions.

FF. Egg and Spoon Race. Open to all riders. Spoons and eggs will be provided by NWAHJA. The riders with the fastest time is declared the winner.

D2. NWAHJA Hunter Derby: 10 jump minimum. 2'6" or 3f ft with at least one fence set 3" to 6" higher than the course. There will be two rounds. At least one in and out, bending line. Unrelated distance, one long approach. Ground lines not required for appropriate fences. All oxers will be off set (back rail higher than front rail). Additional test on course may include: trot fence, lead horse over fence, tight turn option, halt, back up, walk and obstacle (not to exceed 12"). Numerical scores will be announced after each round. Ribbons through 10th. Awards through 6th. Awards 2nd through 6th presented by Kayvonne Primm. **Saturday evening indoor arena**

J3. 3 Phase Jumper Challenge: Open to all. Class will consist of 3 jumper classes with fence heights of 3'. **Ribbons will be awarded in each phase—however winner for the Challenge will be rider with the overall lowest total score for all 3 phases.**

Phase 1—Long Course, Minimum of 10 obstacles, with at least one combination. Table II Section 1. Four penalty points are scored for a knockdown or refusal. One fault added per second over time. If there is a tie, the fastest time wins. **Saturday evening indoor arena.**

Phase 2—Short Course, Maximum of 8 obstacles, with oxers present. Table III. Convert faults to time. One fault added per second over time. **Sunday morning after division jumpers.**

Phase 3—4 Bar—Four verticals set 24 feet apart. 1st fence to begin at 2'3, 2nd fence 2'6", 3rd fence 2'9", 4th fence 3'. All entrants to ride through obstacles. Clean rides will go on to the second round where each fence will be raised 1 hole. Class will continue until only one horse/rider remains. If a competitor knocks down or refuses a jump—penalty points are added. Penalty points incurred are lower as the jumps get higher. **Saturday 8am Lower arena.**

Round 1—8 points Round 2—6 points Round 3—4 points

Round 4—2 points All further rounds—1 point



Medal Classes Amateurs Only. The rider must be a member and the horse must be registered to a member of NWAHJA in order to enter this class. Equitation class over a course that is slightly more difficult than the routine hunter course. Course stresses competent and accurate riding skills. The top four riders after the first round will be called back for additional testing. The winning rider in each medal class qualifies for the finals. Once a rider wins the medal class, he/she may not ride that class again. The second (2nd) place rider may keep riding until he/she wins the class. It is the judge's discretion as to which tests may be asked. 2' & NWAHJA Medal Finals will be held during the year end show.

Classes: 45 (2' Medal) and 48 (NWAHJA Medal: 2'6")

USEF Tests

1. Halt (4 to 6 seconds) and/or back
2. Hand gallop
3. Figure eight at the trot demonstrating change of diagonals
4. Figure eight at the canter demonstrating simple change of lead
5. Work collectively at the walk, trot and canter
6. Pull up and halt (4 to 6 seconds)
7. Jump obstacles on a figure eight course
8. Ride without stirrups or drop and pick up stirrups
9. Jump low obstacles at the walk and trot as well as the canter. The maximum height for a walk obstacle is 3'. The maximum height for a trotting obstacle is 3'.
10. Dismount and mount. Individually
11. Turn on the forehand
12. Figure eight at the canter on the correct lead, demonstrating flying change of lead.
13. Execute serpentine at the trot and/or canter on correct lead demonstrating simple or flying lead changes.

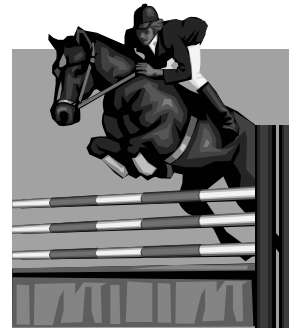

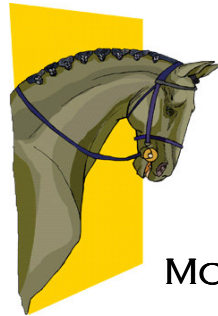

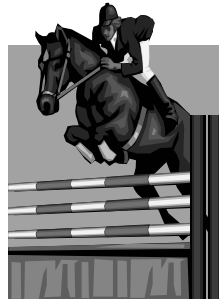
